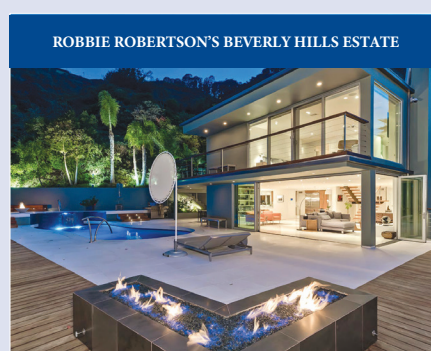

The Los Angeles City Hall at 200 N Spring Street downtown was completed in 1926. It was designed by John C Austin, John Parkinson, and Albert C Martin. Visitors can attend Council meetings and see various exhibits and displays that are available for viewing. The building is based on an Egyptian mausoleum and is similar in appearance to the downtown library which was built just before it. The finding of the King Tut tomb by Lord Carnarvan and Howard Carter in 1922 apparently had a substantial influence

on both buildings. The City Hall tower was supposed to be the tallest building in Los Angeles so until 1964 no structure in the City was permitted to exceed its height. After 1964 that requirement was ended. There have been numerous movies using City Hall as a location which include, War of the Worlds, The Two Jakes, Barton Fink, Father's Day, Liar-Liar, and Never Been Kissed. The seat of our local government is always worth a visit and to climb the imposing Spring Street steps although for security reasons they have changed the public entrance to a side door.
